

## Congwong nudity debate rages online

A police raid on an unofficial nudist beach at La Perouse has ignited a furious online de-bate about whether Little Congwong should be declared a clothing optional beach.


The NSW Free Beach Action Group is at-tempting to have the beach classified as an official nudist beach and if the online debate is anything to go by, the group has plenty of support.

The Southern Courier took to the streets

around La Perouse last week to see if the word on the street reflected the online de-bate and found that most people thought that because the beach was private and could be protected from families, they had no issue with it being a nudist beach.

Because of the controversial nature of the topic, many asked not to be identified in the street poll, but two people were brave enough to put their name and face to the debate.

Darko Malnar, of La Perouse, said: "(Nudity)'s a good thing; I'm European, so to me it's normal. But I find that Australia can be a bit conservative at times. In Europe everyone

Annette Clancey, of Chifley, said: "I'm not against nudist beaches as long as they're not around families. Each to their own, I think. If it's a moral issue, then I understand why the council wants to shut it Ms Clancey down."
