A solution or just a plan?

WHILE buses that run late or fail to turn up at all are some of the frus-trations that have gripped southeastern Sydney commuters, the Premier, Kristina Keneally, is prom-ising improved services through her Metropolitan Transport Plan.

Southerncourier.com.au has been a sounding board for frustrated commuters like Catherine Jefferies, who described the Eastlakes bus service as "terrible and always late", and Rusty O'Brien, who said of the 301 and 303 bus service from Mascot and Eastlakes into the City: "If they run on time it's like winning the lottery.

They are always late and sometimes don't show up at all."

But a plan is on the table, according to Ms Keneally, in the form of the State Government's long-awaited \$50 billion 10-year metropolitan transport blueprint. The blueprint includes 1000 new

buses and bus priority measures like GPS traffic light priority. The allocations at this stage mean

as many as 79 new buses across the southeast. The plan is also looking at a new bus route from Bondi Junction to Hurstville, via Randwick and Maroubra Junction.

Ms Keneally, who is also the Heffron

MP, said new bus lanes would be iden-


dors were complete.
"We will also use data on passenger demand to identify additional routes," Ms Keneally said. "These operators have day-to-day, frontline experience, which qualifies them well to identify the areas of most need."

Three extra bus routes have already been put in place in the local area as part of the plan: Randwick to City, Maroubra Junction to City, and Bondi Junction to Burwood, via Randwick and Maroubra Junction.

NSW Opposition Leader Barry O'Farrell said the public would take the blueprint with a grain of salt, saying the Government had come a transport plan.

"The public will judge this rotting. incompetent Labor Government on its record over the past 15 years, that won't be washed away by yet another transport blueprint, one of 10 to be produced by this Government—none of which have ever been delivered,"
